The Essentials

Every child has a plastic carry bag in order that they can bring the relevant materials for these 3 essentials home every night and return them every morning.

Reading

This should be done for 5 minutes nightly, which is to be recorded by an adult at home in the children's reading record. Click the QR code below for examples of useful questions to support comprehension skills.



Spellings

Every child has their own, personalised, set of spellings in a booklet. They should learn a minimum of 5 words per week for their weekly test.

- Year 3 expectation = Under The Sea
- Year 4 expectation = Pirate
- Year 5 expectation = Detective
- Year 6 expectation = Monster

Times Tables

You should take ideas from the superhero training booklet and practice times tables in order to prepare for battling.

The National expectation is that all children know all rapid recall facts up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4.

This term, each child can choose and complete least one activity from the ideas below and relate it to their topic / science work as closely as possible. We will have a presentation day to showcase all work at the end of the term.
