MyLO: Researching a famous 1960s band Play The Beatles - Help! - YouTube Ask if anyone knows who this band is/has heard the song before? The Beatles – Help (1965) Tell the children that the Beatles were one of the most famous bands of the 60s. They are going to research and write a magazine article about The Beatles for a history magazine. Star 1/SEN/Star 2 Watch https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=BLPpjKay990 Look at all-about-the-beatles-printed and fill in The-Beatles-mind map with all the information they have gathered. Star 3: With TA in the pod. Watch on a laptop (& repeat if necessary): https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=BLPpjKay990 Children to write & organise research notes about The Beatles (bullet-points) in their books while watching the video. Then they share & compare with the rest of the group. Add to their notes. In pairs, make an information poster using all the information they have gathered. Plenary Watch & listen to another Beatles song: The Beatles - Penny Lane - YouTube	MyLO: Researching a musician from The Beatles ALL = English Sticky Facts Day 2 books/or/whiteboards Recap yesterday's research and share some facts. Tell the children that they will be choosing one of the 'Fab Four' to research in more detail today. Resources to use: beatles-band-members and The Beatles Information and library books Star 1/SEN: Fill in Beatles Let Me Tell You About... Star 2: Create a 'fact-file' about one of The Beatles or fill in Beatles Let Me Tell You About... Star 3: Create a 'fact-file' about one of The Beatles. Plenary Hot-Seat Activity' – children use their research to answer questions as if they were John, Paul, George or Ringo.	MYLO: Analysing Beatles lyrics about a character Watch https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=HuS5NuXRb5Y Or play 12 Eleanor Rigby What do the children remember about the song: Who is in it? What objects are in the song? What do the children think? Look at the lyrics on ALL WEEK Character writing ppt slide 13 and discuss any words or phrases the children may not be aware of: 'darning socks' 'wedding rice' 'writing a sermon' This song was written by John Lennon and Paul McCartney. It is a song about people being lonely and how, although people may not show it because they are around others, they can still be lonely. Star 1/SEN: PRINT slide 13 and highlight all the information about Eleanor Rigby. As a group, talk about what the lyrics actually mean and what they tell us about Eleanor Rigby. Make some notes. Take a line of lyrics and create a picture with speech and thought bubbles. Star 2/3: With T/TA in pod. Explore metaphoric phrases and make notes in books. Ask the children what this line means: Waits at the window, wearing a face she keeps in a jar by the door, Who is it for? Does she really have a face in a jar? reference to make-up or smile she has to pretend she is not lonely Who is it for: although she 'puts on this face' no-one really cares if she is happy or sad because she has no friends anyway Repeat for: Eleanor Rigby picks up the rice in the church where a wedding has been, Lives in a dream. What is her dream? Why is it not reality? Eleanor Rigby died in the church and was buried along with her name. Explore the meaning of being last in her family line/without children. Plenary Show ppt slide 13 and discuss the children's ideas.
