Our focus in maths is developing confidence with fractions. Can you add fractions with the same denominator? Can you spot when two fractions are equivalent, even if they look different? Please use the Adding Fractions to practise accurate addition, and the Equivalent Fractions activity to explore equal values using visual models. Adults, answers are attached to support marking.		
Our focus in grammar right now is all about building brilliant sentences! Clear, confident and carefully punctuated they should be – but do you know the difference between a statement and a question? Can you spot a command ? Or write an exciting exclamation ? And what about adding extra detail using a fronted adverbial at the start of a sentence? To support this learning at home, please use the Adverbials Challenge sheet to practise adding fronted adverbials (don't forget the comma!) and the Statements, Questions, Commands and Exclamations activity to revise sentence types and punctuation.
